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## CITY PRE-COUNCIL MEETING

September 4th, 2018

**Call to order:** A pre-meeting of the Council was held on September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2018 in the Council Chambers located at City Hall, 215 Chester Ave. Mayor Brant called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. ### **New Business:**

- 1.) Meeting held with citizens and Waters Engineering regarding improvements to Wheeler Street.  
Meeting was held at 6:00 pm.

### **Public Forum and Discussion:**

- Discussion began with the presentation of John Chittenden of Waters Engineering to the citizens of the area of Wheeler Street on the proposed solutions that have been made to prevent flooding in the North of the area being discussed.
- Mayor Norman Brant had addressed council and the citizens that this area has been through rough times and has many bumps, etc. that have caused issues. He stated that it was his goal to address this if he became mayor and as such is doing so.
- There have been many discussions on the best way to resolve the issues and flooding. It has been determined that by installing an underground pipeline and installing concrete storm grates that the issue of flooding can be corrected. 18 inch pipe will be used to give best flow.
- The soil in the area is very poor and currently the road acts as a dam as it has not been developed properly.
- Inlets will be installed at one between each citizen's driveways.
- The concrete dam grate will be flat and will be able to be mowed over without concern and will not create any eyesores to the property. These will also serve as a clean-out.
- Each driveway will act as a dam and the ditches will be filled and dug to ensure they continue to remain the lowest part of the area.
- This will hopefully help slow down the flooding issues with the South as well.
- The School is working on a resolution on the South with fixing their current drainage, so we will be working with them and determine their plans, so that in the future we can proceed with other corrections.
- This will be one solid line ended at Ramsey Creek.
- Sheet flooding will be helped with this project. No raising of any asphalt will occur and inlets will be lower than street grade.
- Citizens questioned the time frame of the project and it was stated by John Chittenden of Waters Engineering, that if bids were to be started and council is in agreement, the project could begin as soon

as November 2018. The entire project should be completed in 90 days. The citizens will have no added expenses to the project and will only have yard and area in construction for the estimated 90 day time-period.


- All citizens were in agreement and for the project.
